Foster Hope...Foster Care

Each year the Indiana Department of Child Services investigates more than 11,000 cases of child abuse and neglect a month. Currently, more than 1,100 children are in foster care throughout Lake County, and some can stay in foster care for over a year. There are many misconceptions about these children. While it is true many have emotional hardships most are just looking for and are in need of love.

At Campagna each of our foster families receive a Family Support Team with a Nurse, Case Manager, Therapist, Foster Care Coordinator, Administrative Assistant and Vocational Coordinator to assist with providing support and love for their foster child. Campagna foster parents also receive many other value added services for their foster children. Campagna provides memberships to our foster children to their local Boys and Girls Club. Thanks to the generosity of our donors during the winter holidays we provide several holiday presents to our foster children making the holidays extra special.

During the summer we offer an Adventure Summer Camp to all of our Foster Care Children with door-to-door transportation. Last year our campers were greeted by Rusty the RailCat signing autographs and playing games with the kids. The campers experienced several field trips to the local newspaper, candy factory, I Max Theater, local parks, libraries and the Indiana Dunes. In addition to field trips campers also enjoyed craft projects, cookie decorating, learning how to make pizza and a spa day.

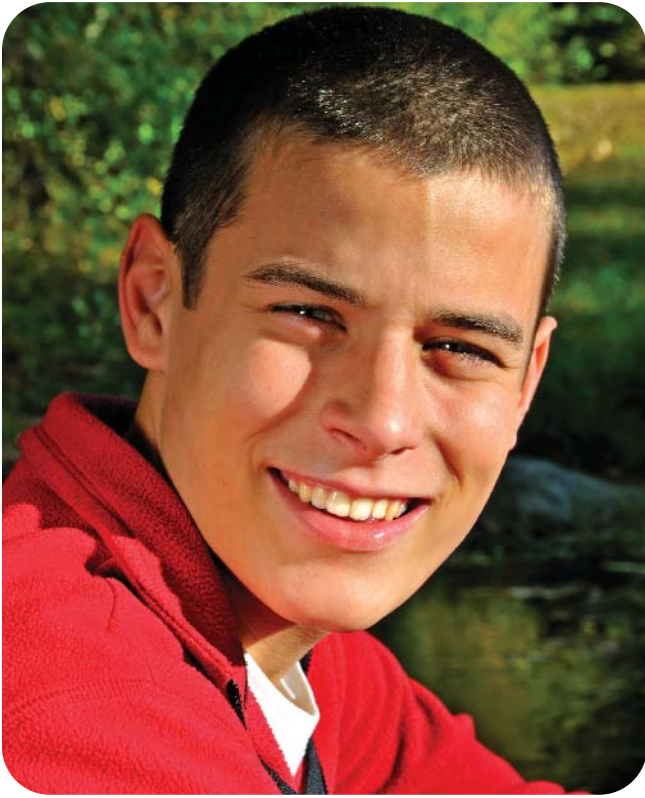

home and community based services

Campagna's Intensive Home & Community Based Services are designed to meet the needs of adolescents with significant emotional and behavioral problems returning home from out-of-home care or psychiatric hospitalization. We provide a family support team containing a Psychiatrist, Nurse, Master's-Level Therapist, Case Manager and a Vocational Counselor for the child. Our goal is to provide the clinical intervention and support necessary to help the child remain and thrive in their home and local community.





Adolescent Day Treatment

Campagna Academy's Adolescent Day Treatment Program is designed for male and female children with behavioral or emotional problems who have been unable to maintain stability in the home, school or community setting. Designed to treat the needs of the whole child, our treatment addresses the psychiatric needs, through Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), individual, group and family therapy; educational and vocational needs/independent living needs. We even provide door-to-door daily transportation. Our treatment team consists of licensed teachers, therapists, case managers, nursing staff, psychiatrist, psychologist, and youth care specialists. Our goal is to help improve the child's functioning, while allowing for the child to remain in their home and local community.

Open Residential

For over 60 years, our open residential program has been at the heart of what we do. Our open residential program is open to males who typically fall into the 12-18 age range. Our life-changing services include: MA level therapists, individualized strength-based treatment plans, step-down living arrangements, individual and family therapy, psycho-educational groups, substance abuse treatment, vocational assessment, independent living skills, on-campus employment, off-campus employment, psychiatric services, and therapeutic recreational programs.



Private Secure Residential

Campagna Academy is proud to offer private secure care for young men and women with our 48 bed residence. This state-of-the-art treatment facility resembles an on-campus dorm and includes four on-site classrooms, computer lab, family visitation rooms, fitness center, and therapists' offices. Campagna Academy provides treatment with individual, family and group therapy, individualized on-site education, social skills and anger management training, plus other psycho-educational programs. Residents receive psychiatric services as needed and are continually reassessed for readiness to move to less restrictive living.



Campagna Academy Charter School

Hopes, Dreams and Community are emphasized in Campagna Academy Charter School (CACs) through integration of services and programs to meet the educational needs of all of our students. Whether students come to us with educational obstacles, social and behavioral issues, or need for non-traditional educational options, we have a program to meet their academic needs. CACS is a public charter school focusing on servicing students from Northwest Indiana.

Campagna Academy Charter School offers a variety of classes aimed at offering students the Core 40 or Academic Honors diploma. Students have the opportunity to focus on college preparatory and basic life skill classes that are aimed at student matriculation into the college setting. Students advance through the curriculum through traditional classes as well as non-traditional computerized and virtual classroom settings. Non-traditionally, the General Diploma is offered through the Alternative Program for students who enroll in this program.

Students who require fewer credits may elect to attend an alternative evening program that is offered to participants needing fewer than 20 credits toward graduation. Students in the traditional program may also attend evening school to accelerate their academic program toward graduation. This program is designed to facilitate credit recovery and academic enrichment. All students eligible for this program must maintain a "C" average in all classes.

The General Educational Development (GED) program is designed for students who wish to complete high school requirements, but are not able to complete them in the traditional or non-traditional classroom setting. Through a grouping of five subject tests which, when passed, certify that the taker has achieved basic level academic skills. Sometimes referred to as a General Education Diploma or the Graduate Equivalency Degree, this diploma is an opportunity for students to complete their high school courses and continue in a specified trade or trade program.

Volunteers are a special kind of donor, they share their time and their hearts with Campagna Academy. Last year volunteers joined us as educational mentors working on the cottages, pods and in the GED classroom to ensure the youth of Campagna get the extra help they need with their studies to succeed. Other volunteers helped our residents prepare and practice for their first off-campus job interviews. Volunteers also helped with special events like our annual 5K Run for the Roses, Reality Check Day, United Way Day of Caring, and Foster Care Adventure Summer Camp. Thank you to all of the Campagna volunteers for all that you do and thank you for your partnership in our mission of Restoring Hope and Building Dreams.

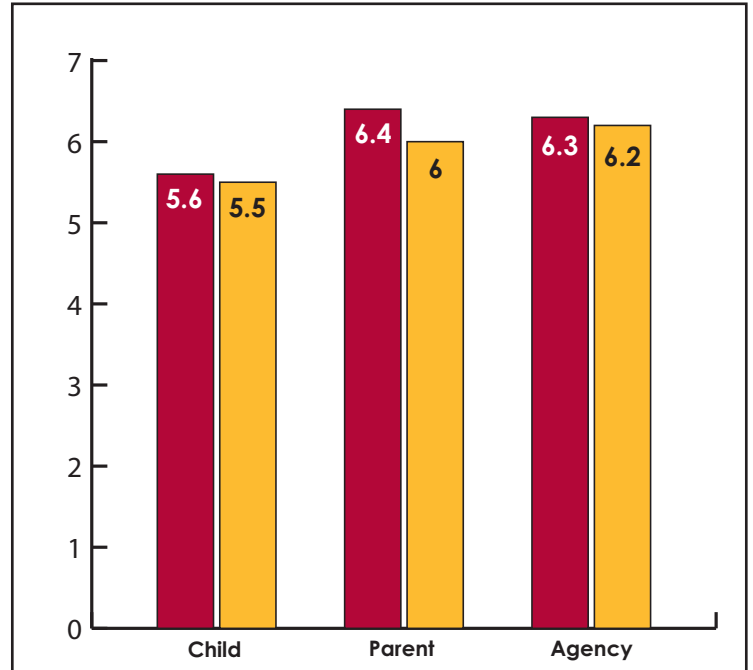

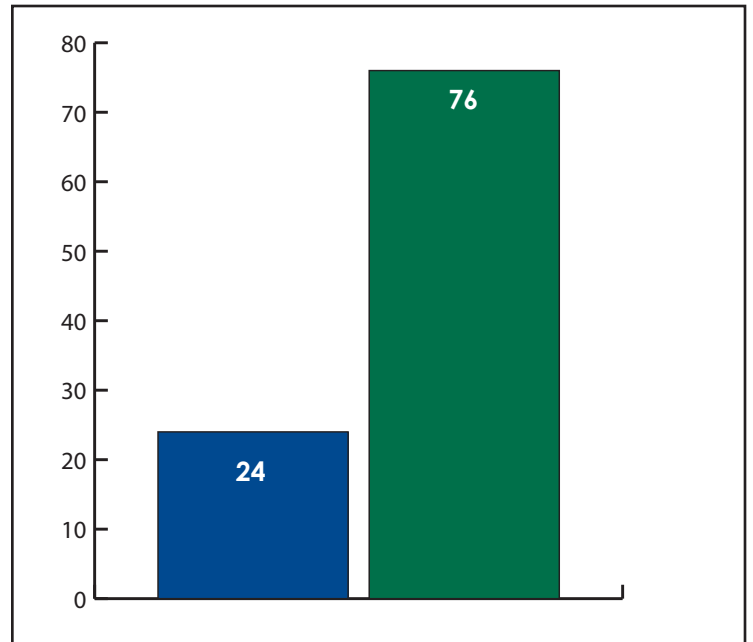
Overall Measure of Residential Program Satisfaction*

Population Percent of Charter School

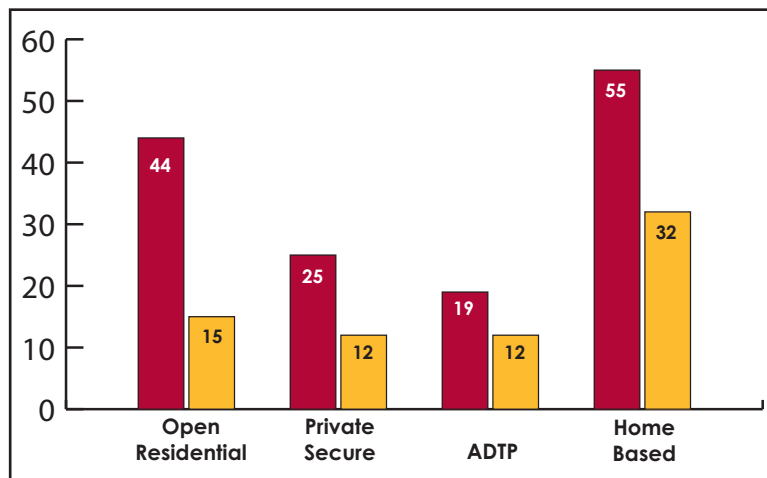

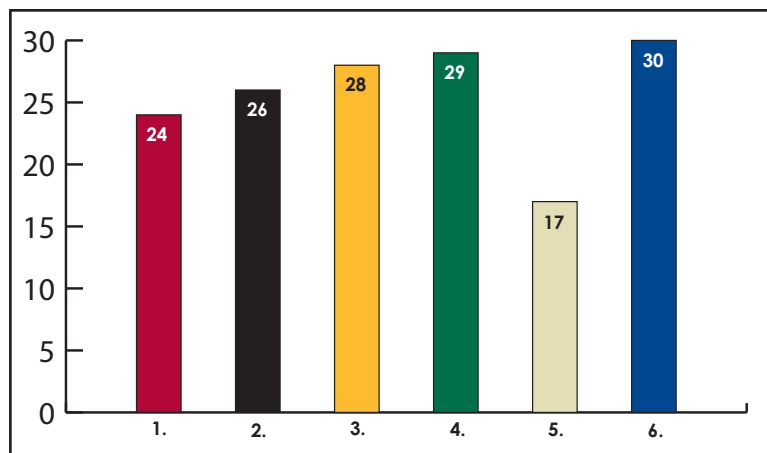

Percentage of Clients Successfully Employed at Discharge



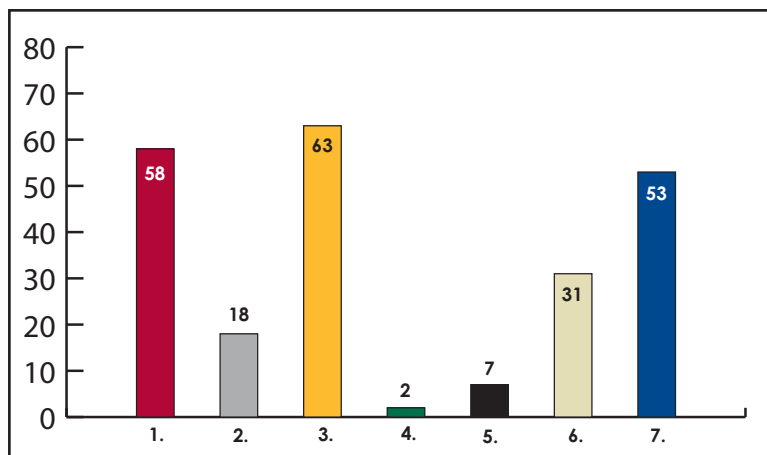
