What Is ADTP?

Campagna Academy's Alternative Day Treatment Program, or ADTP, is an accredited day treatment program that allows an at-risk youth to grow academically and clinically. The mission of ADTP is to provide educational and behavioral health services in an integrated manner to juveniles who experience psychiatric and behavioral issues making it challenging to receive an effective education. The program serves juveniles in grades six through twelve, as well as those clients opting for the High School Equivalency Exam. Our program focuses on stabilizing the youth's behavior with a structured behavioral management program that incorporates Dialectical Behavior Skills (DBT). Our Alternative Day Treatment Program is approved by the Indiana Department of Child Services, and accredited by the Council on Accreditation of Services for Family and Children. The goal of our program is to address specific learning needs of all clients by developing Individualized Service Learning Plans, or ISPs. The ISPs tailor a plan to each client's unique learning style and needs that will allow the greatest achievement.

ADTP Program At Campagna Academy

- We offer door-to-door transportation
- Staff to client ratio of 1:6
- The specialized educational services include a licensed building level administrator, live instruction by a certified/licensed teacher, and TASC teacher (Test Assessing Secondary Completion)
- The clinical and educational staff work closely to provide group counseling, social skills development, therapeutic activity groups, and the implementation of Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT)
- Each student will receive individualized service and transition plans
- WorkOne is located on-site
- On-site nursing department and staff
- To be eligible for the program the Child must demonstrate an emotional behavior or psychiatric problem that severely impacts their ability to function in school. This may also include their failure to attend school. The child may be at risk for expulsion from their current school district, and has a history of failed educational attempts. The student must be in grades six through twelve, and be a Lake County high school resident, with an IQ of 65 or above.
