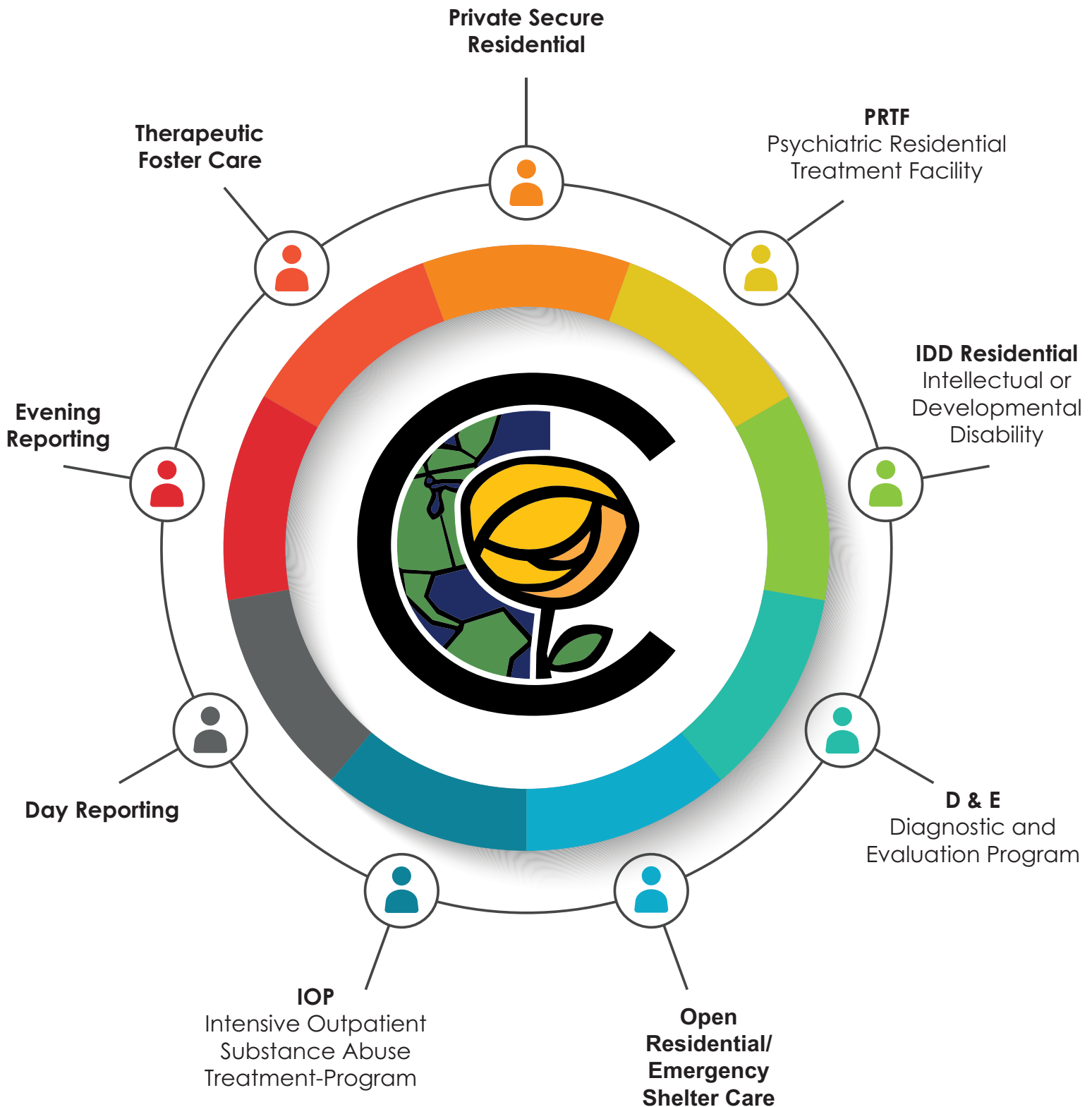

Our son Jimmy was on the wrong path. He was obstinate, disobedient, disrespectful, truant, and doing things no 12-year-old should be doing. After months and months of traditional therapy, a short residential stay, and a near miss with juvenile detention; we found Campagna Academy. Jimmy became a resident at Campagna Academy in early January 2020. Dropping him off that night was very difficult and heart wrenching - but an absolute necessity. Getting through that first week was rough on all of us. Once Jimmy settled in, the nightly phone calls became more positive and upbeat. The monthly reporting began to come back more and more favorable. Jimmy's academic performance while at Campagna was the best we had seen in years! Jimmy really began to understand the treatment team's culture and the program at Campagna. During his final two months there, our son received high compliments from staff and his therapist. They felt he had really turned a corner and was getting close to coming home. Jimmy spent seven months at Campagna Academy. He graduated from their program and came back into our full-time care at the end of July. Jimmy worked harder than even he knew was possible. The staff at Campagna brought out the best in our son.

2020 was on pace to be one of the most difficult years this country has ever seen. Dealing with everyday life has become much more of a chore than it ever used to be. The staff at Campagna deserve high praise and commendation for the job they were able to do and continue to do. What is their job "normally?" They are tasked with helping to shape the minds and behaviors of children like my son. They work tirelessly to help redirect these young men and women to help them graduate and become fully functioning members of society. That type of work is not for everyone add a global pandemic into the mix and you can all imagine how difficult those days became. Our sincere gratitude toward the people of Campagna Academy will never be forgotten. Without their dedication and their genuine concern for all their residents, success stories would not be not possible.

How is our son Jimmy now that he is back at home? He is asking for permission. He is respectful to his parents. He is thinking before he is acting. He is helping around the house. He started high school in the fall. He is being a kid!

We thank Campagna Academy for helping to transform our son Jimmy into a respectful young man. Campagna's program, structure, and staff made it all possible. We are proud of Jimmy's return into our family, and we look forward to his continued success in whatever life has in store for him.

# Planting Seeds of Growth

**We have the expertise, staff, and resources to continue to help additional at-risk youth. Because of your generous support we can continue to say “Yes” to new opportunities.**

December 2020 we opened the doors to our “Pathways Emergency Shelter Care Program”. The purpose of our Emergency Shelter Care (ESC) program is to meet the immediate therapeutic and housing needs of youth who need short-term residential placement and treatment, provide structure in a nurturing environment.



In April of 2021 we opened the doors to our newest program Diagnostic and Evaluation. Thanks to the generosity of The Leep Family Foundation, Mr. Leep and Team Toyota in Schererville, we were able to renovate two of our older campus cottages to meet the needs of this very specific populations of children. In addition to the renovations, we were able to provide on-site recreation for our clients.

Clients placed into our Diagnostic and Evaluation program are in acute distress, manifesting atypical and disruptive behavior patterns, experiencing frequent placement changes, they are in need of a neuro-psychiatric and developmental assessment to identify/determine an appropriate placement/plan, and they need behavioral stabilization. Comprehensive diagnostic evaluations will incorporate information from multiple disciplines including nursing assessments, psychiatric evaluations, educational assessment, bio-psycho-social assessment, and psychological testing, as deemed necessary. Neuropsychological tests and medication evaluation will be included when needed.

## “That’s So 2020”

### **1176 Meals Delivered**

.....

When our Day & Evening Community Based Programs were closed in March 2020 due to the statewide stay at home order and our clients could not come to our campus, our kitchen and transportation teams jumped into action. They prepared and delivered 1176 meals to our community-based clients ensuring that they would not go hungry.

### **5,268 Masks Donated**

.....

When PPE and masks were not available, we turned to social media and asked for help. Volunteers and donors answered the call! In 2020 over 5,000 masks were donated, many of them handmade.

### **647 Virtual Medical Staffings**

.....

We moved our medical staffing to virtual. Between April 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020, we provided 647 Virtual Medical Staffing Visits for our residential clients with our Medical Psychiatrist Dr. Frampton.

### **Virtual Foster Parent Trainings**

.....

When the pandemic shut our doors to the public and our normal in-person trainings for foster parents could not take place on our campus we turned to Zoom. Thanks to our generous donors we were able to provide web cameras and tablets to our Foster Parents. Thanks to Zoom we were able to continue our scheduled trainings and provide much needed support to our Foster Families.

## 2020 Highlights

100%

In 2020, 100% percent of our clients discharging from our IDD, Private Secure, and Open Residential Programs had a positive educational outcome. 94% were enrolled in school and 6% had obtained a high school diploma. *\*2020 IARCA Outcomes*

87%

In 2020, 87% of the clients in our Private Secure Residential Program were discharged to a less restrictive environment. 60% had reunification with family/relative, 13% were adopted, 4% were emancipation or went to Independent Living and 10% went to a Permanent Custodial Relative.

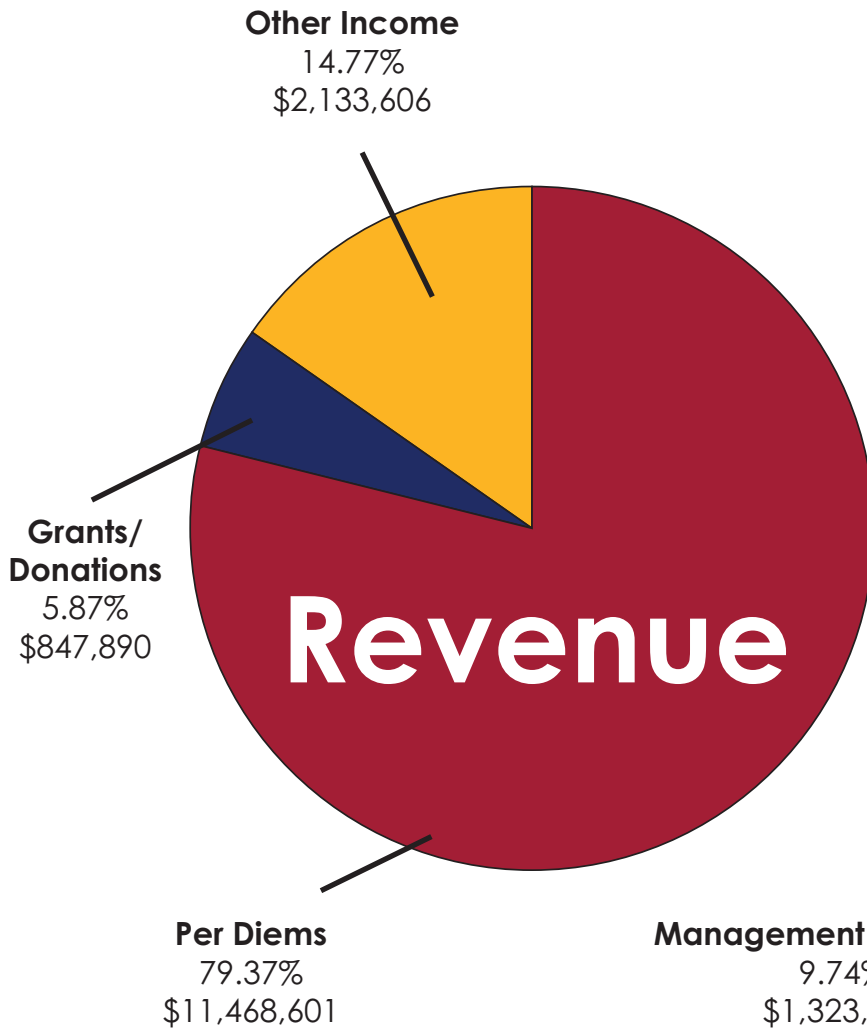
In 2020, Campagna had a 100% graduation rate in our IOP, Intensive Outpatient Program for Substance Abuse Treatment. Twenty clients graduated from the program. They received the support from Campagna to lay the foundation for a functional life free from substances and equipped with the tools to manage their addiction. Our graduates also learned coping skills, social skills, and they developed a healthy sense of self-esteem through use of evidence-based practices. *\*IOP QA 2020 Data*

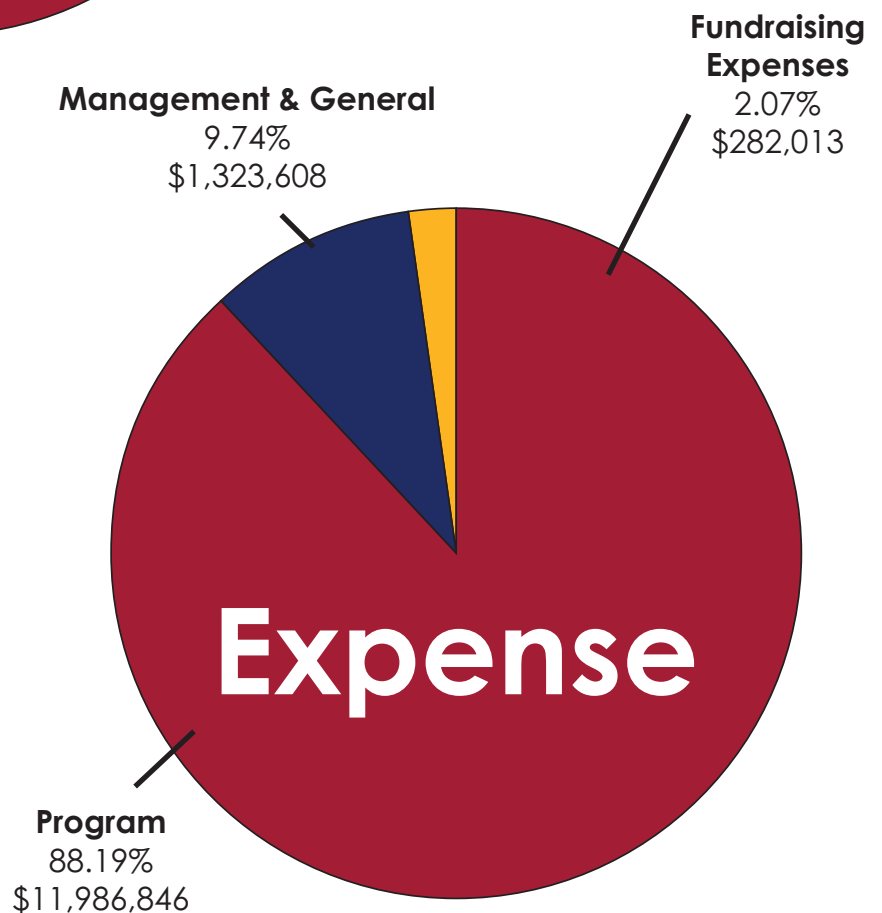
